



Name Change Checklist Provided By Name Change Alabama

- Get a legal order from the court to change names and make certified copies of this court order.
- Fill out and submit the form, provide the necessary documents, and update your name with the Social Security Administration.
- Get a court order and visit the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) office to update your name on your driver's license or state ID.
- Submit Form DS-82 if eligible for renewal within one year, attach a court order, and update your name on your passport.
- With a copy of the court order, update your account identification in your bank. And also update your name on your credit card by contacting the authority.
- Change your data including employee records, tax filings, and payroll.
- Contact the insurance company, provide them with accurate information, and update your name on health, life, auto, and other insurance policies.
- Update your voter registration record by contacting the nearby election office and providing documentation.
- Update your name and account details on social media platforms and online accounts.
- Update your name change procedure on medical records, legal documents such as wills, trusts, and other legal documents. To do so, consult with an attorney.
- Give documentation to the registrar's office and Update your name with schools, colleges, and universities, and also notify family, friends, and colleagues of your name change.
- Inform the relevant state authorities about your name change, change your email display name, and update your online profiles.
